**Why I deserve this scholarship (include goals for your future plans):**

I have ADD, anxiety, and learning disabilities. Despite this all I have used the resources around me. I have also learned how to be my best advocate. One day, my mom was talking to my grandma about how I wasn't up to my fifth grade reading level, and my grandma brought up a friend who was a special education teacher. She asked this friend if she would be willing to tutor me. She was willing and took me from the kindergarten level to fifth grade reading level. She did this by using visuals, teaching me English rules, and how to sound out words. Because I didn't have a normal elementary education up to this point, I was very behind my normal grade level. I don't want that to happen to any other person. Because of these experiences, I am empathetic toward others with disabilities and have had a desire to work with others that have disabilities.

Now that I am in college, I have learned I want to get my degree in ASL. Because language was always hard for me, I have developed a desire and fascination for different languages. Also, communication is important to me and I don't like it when a language barrier is in my way.

I have completed 27 credits with a cumulative GPA of 2.8. I am currently taking sixteen credits and passing all my classes. I completed my certified nursing assistant certification in December 2014. I also am first-aid and CPR certified, and I have kept all my certifications current. I have had to learn how to work hard for what I want. It has been a process to get to know what I want to do as a job. Now, I am ready to dig my heels in and get this degree.

I don't qualify for a pell grant. My family's adjusted gross income is above the pell threshold and my parents aren't able to help with additional college expenses like housing, textbooks, and more. Previously my two siblings and I were all going to college and was able to

get a pell grant. This year I am the only college student in my family. Also, my mom was employed last year but this year due to health and family problems has had to quit her job. I am hesitant to take out loans which is why I am applying for as many scholarships as I can get.



Last semester I earned an A grade in a challenging Anatomy Lab class as well as an A in the corresponding Anatomy Lecture class.

To be able to say that I have an Associate Degree from Dixie State University has been a huge accomplishment for me. I work extremely hard and do not give up. Although some in my situation might be satisfied with earning an 2 year degree, I am not. I look forward to the day when I graduate with my Bachelor's Degree. 
